

Allocation of M-100s, Automarks, 650's and booths for February 2, 2010 Special Election (Board Vote Needed)

1. **Requirement of Public Meeting** – R.C. 3501.11(I) and Directive 2008-64 requires that each board of elections conduct a full vote of the board during public session on the allocation and distribution of voting machines, tabulating equipment and marking devices for each precinct prior to election day.

The total number of M100s (precinct count optical scanners) for distribution for use on Election Day is 31 (1 per precinct) plus an unlimited amount of extra up to 525. All extra M100's are held at the Board of Elections for backups to replace non working equipment when needed.

The total number of Auto marks for distribution for use on Election Day is 11 (1 per polling location) plus an unlimited amount of extra up 252 with all others held at the board of elections for backup's to replace non working equipment when needed.

The total number of 650s (high speed optical scanners) is six. They will remain at the Board of Elections, 470 Grant Street, Akron, Ohio, 44311.

The number of booths for each precinct is one per each 100 registered voters, with four being the minimum number of booths.

The Summit County Board of Elections follows the Secretary of State's guidelines and Ohio Revised Code for allocating voting equipment for each election as described in Directive 2008-64 and ORC 3506.19
