Allocation of M-100's, AutoMARKS, EPB's and Voting Booths for the May 7, 2019 Primary/Special Election

Requirement of Public Meeting – R.C. 3501.11 (I) requires that each board of elections conduct a full vote of the board during public session on the allocation and distribution of voting machines, tabulating equipment and marking devices for each precinct prior to each election day.

The total number of M100s (precinct count optical scanners) for election day is 290 (262 - 1 M100 for each precinct and 28 extra). Extra M100s will be charged, kept at the Board of Elections, and available for backup deployment. In accordance with Ohio Secretary of State Directive 2017-11, M100's will be programmed "such that a voter can cast a ballot using any voting device in the location".¹

The total number of AutoMARKS for election day is 134 (116 - 1 per polling location, and 18 extra) Extra AutoMARKS will be charged, kept at the Board of Elections, and available for backup deployment.

The total number of 850's (high speed optical scanners) is 3. They will remain at the Board of Elections.

The number of EPBs (Electronic Poll Books) for Election Day is 420 (262 – 1 per precinct, 116 – 1 per polling location, 15 – 1 per troubleshooter team, and 27 extra). Extra EPB's will be charged, kept at the Board of Elections, and available for backup deployment.

The number of booths for each precinct is 1 per each 100 registered voters, with 4 being the minimum.

The Summit County Board of Elections follows the Secretary of State's guidelines and Ohio Revised Code for allocating voting equipment for each election.
